Kia ora Parents and Caregivers,

Next Thursday we are having a teacher inservice day with Maths consultant Charlotte Wilkinson. Because it is a Thursday we are having school as normal for the students. There will be relievers in every class. We look forward to seeing as many parents as possible at the evening meeting with Charlotte. We expect this will go from 7.30 - 8.30pm.

At the Student-led Conferences we will be giving you an indicator sheet to take home with information about the level your child is working at. We also have a Ministry of Education pamphlet that gives specific information about what you can do at home with your child at their present level. We hope this will help to give you a clear picture your child's progress.



We expect that all parents will attend their child's student-led conference. This is how we report on your child's progress. If you have not made a time to do this, please contact your child's teacher as soon as possible.



Please make sure your child is going to bed at a reasonable hour. We have noticed some children yawning at the start of the day and they have said they are not going to bed until late. Sleep is the time when the brain processes all it has taken in during the day and the body is refreshed. To be the best they can be, children need to have adequate sleep.

I recently went to a Principal's Association meeting where research was shared about attendance and the impact on student achievement. If a child is not

attending school for 95% of the year or more they are at risk of underachievement. Unless the child is sick, they should not be away for more than 10 days per year. We will be looking at our school statistics in relation to this.

I have been talking to a child from each class about their learning this week. It is such a pleasure for me to spend this time with an individual and have an in-depth conversation with them. We are very fortunate to have such wonderful teachers at our school. It is obvious when I am looking at the books, that the teachers scaffold the children's learning. It was also really heart warming to hear that every child thought of themselves as a learner, that they had a very positive view of school and expected that they would make progress.
